

### THE 53<sup>RD</sup> FRENCH OLYMPIC WEEK HYÈRES -TPM

### French Olympic Week is back!

From April 23 to 30, 2022 the elite of Olympic sailing will be in Hyères for one of the most anticipated moments of the season. The SOF returns to the Hyérois waters to the delight of the sailors and spectators alike. The FFVoile, thanks to the continued commitment of the City of Hyères and the Métropole TPM (Toulon Provence Méditerranée), will have the pleasure of welcoming the best sailors in the world in preparation for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games.

#### For the first time in France, the 10 Olympic classes that will be represented at the Paris 2024 Olympic Games will be present in Hyères from April 23 to 30.

The 10 Olympic classes: **iQFOiL** (men and women), **Kite** (men and women) **ILCA** (women and men), **49er FX** (women and men), **Nacra 17** (mixed), **470** (mixed) will compete on the Hyères field of play, which is as technical as it is tactical and renowned for its often strong easterly winds.

## THE CLASSES



### **iQFOiL** Men's & Women's (new Olympic windsurfing class)

iQFOiL is a new discipline that will be the next Olympic windsurfing format for the 2024 Olympic Games in France. The iQFOiL is equipped with a foil allowing it to fly on the water.

Currently, the French are dominating this new format, with among others, both Nicolas Goyard and Hélène Noesmoen, becoming the World and European champions.

### **KiteFoil** Men's and Women's (foiling kitesurfing)

KiteFoil is a new discipline, which will take its place in the 2024 Olympics for the first time. The KiteFoil consists of a directional kiteboard and a mast that enables it to take off and fly over the waves.

In 2021, the French largely dominated the international circuit with, in particular, Théo de Ramecourt - world champion, Axel Mazella, 2<sup>nd</sup> at the world championships and European champion and Lauriane Nolot, 3<sup>rd</sup> at the world championships.

### ILCA 7 et 6 Men's & Women's (solo dinghy)

Better known as the Laser, now renamed ILCA 7, the single-handed dinghy was created in 1970 from a design by Canadian Bruce Kirby. It has been "Olympic" since the Olympic Games in Atlanta in 1996. It is a "one design", meaning all the competitors have exactly the same boat. The idea being that it should be the physical ability and race sense of the sailor that make the difference.

The ILCA 6, reserved for women, has the same hull, but a slightly smaller canvas rig. It became an Olympic class for the Sydney Olympics in 2000.

### 470 (mixed double-handed dinghy)

Queen of the classes, this dinghy is sailed doublehanded and has been part of France's heritage since its design by the naval architect, André Cornu, in 1960. It is designed for sailing in light and medium conditions. It was enthusiastically adopted and became Olympic at the Montreal Olympic Games in 1976.

It will be mixed doubles for the first time for this new Olympiad and is attracting many new and very promising French duos.



## THE CLASSES



### **49er / 49er FX** Men's and Women's (high-performance double-handed dinghy)

Designed by the Australian, Julian Bethwaite, this double-handed dinghy is the representative for the "Skiffs" at the Olympic Games.

This family of boats, which plane in all conditions, is truly spectacular. They can be hard to handle for the sailors, but are an exhilarating ride. Their races are guaranteed to be gripping.

### Nacra 17 (mixed double-handed hydrofoil catamaran)

The Nacra changed considerably in 2017, moving from curved daggerboards to Z-foils, and rudders with wings. The boat can now completely fly. Its construction has also evolved, the hulls are partially carbon. With its Z-foils and its large carbon mast, the Nacra is a really lively boat.

The French team is made up of prestigious crews who have already won numerous international medals.
